#### **VALCOUR ISLAND LIGHTHOUSE**

Unexpectedly, we were able to schedule regular public visitation hours at the lighthouse this summer, thanks to the efforts of Roger and Linda Harwood. The lighthouse is open from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. on Sunday afternoons. The Open House is scheduled on Saturday, August 26 from 12:00 to 5:00 p.m. (storm date: August 27). If you wish to reach the island on August 26 via the Juniper Tour Boat, call its office directly at 561-8970 for information and reservations.

Due to the delayed passing of the State budget, we still do not know if our application for matching funds from the Environment Protection Fund will be approved. If it is successful, substantial restoration of interior elements of the lighthouse will begin in the early summer of 1996.

Just when you thought you had collected sufficient commemorative T-shirts for a lifetime, we are offering one that most folks can't resist. The design incorporates Valcour Island and identification of beauty spots such as Paradise Bay, Butterfly Bay, Cedar Point, Pebble Beach, Heron Point and, of course, the Valcour Island Lighthouse. Shown is the 1871 date of acquisition of property on the bluff by the U.S. Government to build a beacon for shipping on Lake Champlain.

Just call us at 561-0340 to place your order. Lighthouse Committee chairman Bradley Knapp says that by doing so, you will publicize the lighthouse and help raise funds for its preservation.

We also want to thank Roger Harwood and his friends for their assistance in transporting and installing heavy security materials which are necessary to protect the structure from vandalism. The Valcour Island lighthouse presents a special problem in that it is not accessible by land. Equipment and materials must be loaded into boats, shipped to the island and carried up a steep hill to the lighthouse. It's good to know that our light has a group of devoted friends and protectors to prevent it from being included in the "doomsday" list in which many U.S. lighthouses are designated, both onshore and offshore.

## NEW YORK STATE COUNCIL ON THE ARTS GRANT

CCHA is pleased to announce that it has been awarded a grant of \$4,793.00 in multiyear general operating support. These public funds are designated for the ongoing programs and activities of the Association and its museum.

Thanks to intense lobbying efforts by the museum community and its friends, the \$6.5M cut in NYSCA's funding proposed by the Governor was reduced to \$1.5M. The cut translates into a level of \$30,875,100 which has to be allocated to a multiplicity of museums, historical societies, libraries, and arts organizations around New York State. Everyone who wrote to their elected officials regarding the proposed cuts in NYSCA's funding should know that their efforts helped to avert a real crisis, at least for this year.

## **NEW IN THE MUSEUM SHOP**

A gift of books from CCHA member and author Morris Glenn allows us to offer a very limited quantity of *Lake Champlain Album*, Vol. 2., priced at \$25.00. Published by Morris in 1979 and containing descriptions of Champlain Valley vessels, lighthouses and other structures, the book has been out of print for a long time. Collectors of Lake Champlain historical materials won't want to miss this chance. Another one-time opportunity is a hand-painted version of the poster created by Sid Couchey for this year's Essex Maritime Festival. We also have Sid's color poster depicting a typically humorous futuristic view of Plattsburgh. Also, we are reliably informed that Mr. Couchey, the well known Pale Ontologist, is preparing to offer examples of the "Champ Fozzle", described as a fozzle of a diminutive Icthopod, commonly known as "Champ." It is highly unlikely that the available number of fozzles can satisfy potential demand; fozzle collectors from around the globe will clamor for a specimen of this relic of prehistoric times.
