#### Battle of Plattsburgh Commemoration Weekend

#### September 7 - 11, 2000

Battle of Plattsburgh Commemorative Buttons are available for purchase at the Museum. Costs are \$4.00 for adults, \$2.00 for children 12 and under, with a maximum of \$10.00 per family (2 adults and 2 children) unit. The Button admits the bearer free to all events except the Costume Ball, Biathlon and Juniper Boat Tours.

The Museum will be open 12 – 4 p.m. on Thursday and Friday, September 7 and 8. We will be open from 11:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m., Saturday, September 9 and Sunday, September 11. The wonderful Chateau Ramzey re-enactors will again be here at the Museum demonstrating their skills. We hope to see many of you come through the Museum over the weekend.

Special events commemorating the Battle of Plattsburgh will begin on Thursday. September 7 with a memorial service at 5 p.m., in Riverside Cemetery at the grave of Captain Downie and other British casualties of the Battle. Friday, September 8, will feature the arrival re-enactors, Adirondack Brass and Fireworks!!

A large variety of family activities and events are featured on Saturday, September 9. There will be a Biathlon, a Kids' parade, classic boat show, and the Glengarry Pipes and Drums from Ontario.

On Sunday there are planned tactical demonstrations, the Aiken's Volunteers Fife and Drum Corps, a symphony concert and more kids' activities.

Events come to a close on Monday, September 11, with a memorial service at Crab Island, the burial site of many of the Battle casualties.

The Museum, along with the Kent Delord House Museum and encampment, the Battle of Plattsburgh Interpretive Center and the Macdonough Monument, will be open throughout the weekend.
