August 26, 2002 – Professor Willard Sterne Randall, Author of Benedict Arnold: Patriot and Traitor, speaking on the subject of "Benedict Arnold on Lake Champlain", at the Lake Forest Activity Room, 7:00 p.m. refreshments, 7:30 p.m. program. Professor Randall is the author of 12 books, including 5 biographies. A former investigative reporter, Professor Randall won the national Magazine Award for Public Service from the Columbia Graduate School of Journalism, the Hillman Prize, the Loeb Award ad 3 pulitzer nominations during his 17-year carrer as a journalist for the Philadelphia Bulletin, Philadelphia Enquirer, Philadelphia Magazine and Time Magazine. After gradudate studies in history at Princeton, Professor Randall moved to Vermont to write biographies.
