ANNUAL DINNER

The usual October meeting will be waived to accommodate our annual dinner scheduled on Saturday, October 22. Co-sponsored by the History Department at SUNY Plattsburgh, the event will be held in the Centennial Room in the Angell College Center, State University, Plattsburgh. The evening starts with a cash bar at 6:00 p.m. followed by dinner at 7:00 p.m. An insert in this issue of *North Country Notes* lists the menu and includes a tear-off form. Reservations and payment must be received by Wednesday, October 19.

The highlight of the evening will be the return of a very popular speaker. Willard Sterne Randall, whose biography of Benedict Arnold was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize in 1990, will present a program entitled "Thomas Jefferson's Champlain Vacation". Mr. Randall's book, *Thomas Jefferson: A Life*, was also nominated for a Pulitzer Prize and was named one of the ten best biographies of 1993 by *Publishers Weekly*.

After teaching history and biography for many years, Will Randall is now writing a series of American History textbooks for HarperCollins. His Benedict Arnold program delivered at CCHA's 1991 dinner was highly entertaining and we look forward to an equally fascinating look at the life of Thomas Jefferson. Newly issued in paperback, *Thomas Jefferson: A Life* will be available from the author at our October 22 dinner.

VALCOUR ISLAND LIGHTHOUSE

Although progress on preservation of the lighthouse has been hampered by incidents of vandalism, we continue our efforts to save the lighthouse. During late September members of the Adirondack Builders' Association worked on replacing glass in the light chamber and sealing the walkway on the tower. An award of \$1,000 from the Lake Champlain Partnership Program has enabled the Historical Association to purchase materials needed for interior repairs to the structure. Attendance at the Open House on August 20 was diminished due to stormy weather, but once again it gave the public an opportunity to explore the interior of the structure. Volunteers Lynn & Bill Woythaler and Roger Barrett conducted visitors through the lighthouse and explained its 121-year history.

RECENT ACQUISITIONS

The summer of 1994 was memorable for the number of acquisitions made by the museum. Among them were several editions of the *Northern Intelligencer*, one of the earliest newspapers published in Clinton County. Although the museum does not actively seek donations of newspapers due to their fragility, the difficulty of preserving them, and the availability of their contents on microfilm or microfiche, occasionally we do accept newspapers by reason of their unique contents. Bart Holm was the donor of the recent newspaper acquisitions, following in the footsteps of his mother and aunt, Lucille and Elizabeth Gilliland, who both contributed significantly to the museum's collections. Here are some of the intriguing notices we found:

NOTICE: Whereas Jane, my wife, has behaved herself in a very unbecoming manner, by beating and flogging me at sundry times, and having become determined not to live with her any longer, this is to notify all persons from harboring her or trusting her on my account, as I will not pay any debts of her contracting after this date.

The Commandants of companies are also requested after this order shall have been read on parade, to return as deliquent, all such persons as shall appear at any rendezvous without such uniform and equipage.

(Editorial note: Before the introduction of wood pulp into the manufacture of paper, cloth rags were the staple ingredient, thus ensuring a longer life for the paper. Today, rag paper and board, 100% acid free, are used by museums for preservation of flat paper objects.)

NATIONAL AWARD FOR CCHA MEMBER

Congratulations go to Stanley Ransom who has been awarded a Certificate of Commendation from the American Association of State and Local History. Known in the world of folk music as the "Connecticut Peddler", Mr. Ransom was recognised for his work in the preservation of local history and folklife. Notably, he was the sole award winner from New York State out of 110 winners nationwide. His cassette tapes "Down The Saranac" and "Adirondack Sampler" will soon be followed by a Christmas tape which CCHA hopes to have available at its December meeting.

The Historical Association helped to nominate Stanley Ransom for his prestigious award. Now we wish him continued success in his efforts to preserve North Country folklife traditions.

NEW MERCHANDISE IN THE MUSEUM SHOP

Copies of historical Lake Champlain maps and prints are now available in the Shop, published by the Maritime Museum at Basin Harbor, VT. We offer reproductions of the 1762 map of Lake Champlain by Wm. Brassier (\$21.00, color); the 1776 "Description of the Engagement on Lake Champlain" by R. Sayer (\$12.50); a 1763 map of the lake by Metcalf (\$21.00, color); the 1776 "Account of the Expedition of the British Fleet on Lake Champlain, etc" (Battle of Valcour) by Wm. Faden (\$12.50), and a map of the lake by S.R. Stoddard, 1893 (\$15.00, color). These items are printed on fine quality paper that is suitable for framing.

The Valcour Island Lighthouse has been much in the news lately and we wish to remind members and friends that copies of the print made from an oil painting by local artist Rennie Fenwick are still available. Finely reproduced in color, the lighthouse print is a perfect gift for Christmas, birthdays and presentations.

Yet another idea for Christmas shopping is "History Of Chazy" by Nell Barnett Sullivan and David K. Martin. Originally published in 1970, the book has been out of print for some years. Marie Gennett, Town of Chazy historian, tells us that the hardcover book will be available after Dec. 10. Meanwhile, pre-publication orders will be accepted by the Town of Chazy until Nov. 10 at \$25.00 plus \$3.50 shipping and handling. After that date the book will be priced at \$30.00 plus \$3.50.
